
#### SICK LIST UPDATE



### **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Parishioners,

The Second Vatican Council tells us that the Eucharist is the "Source" and "Summit" of the church's life. Those two words indicate the centrality of the Eucharist to our community. Every ministry of our parish—school, pastoral care, faith formation, facility maintenance, the Fiesta, Madre, everything—begins in the Eucharist. Our identity as the Body of Christ animates every ministry, gives us strength, enables our service and sustains our fidelity. The Eucharist is the source of our life. But it is also the summit toward which all our activity returns. Our life as a community, our commitment to the poor, our prayer and service, our stewardship of blessings all bring us back to the Eucharist as a sign of our life in Christ and our



thanksgiving to God. The Eucharist is good news for the world, as it inspires and unites all the saving action God initiates through us. It is why attendance is so important to us as a community. Being present at Mass puts us in God's hands, allows us to encounter and share divine love and stand together as one body in Christ. Vatican II does not make Mass attendance optional. On the contrary, it underlines the importance of being present to the source and summit of our faith.

### **RACIAL JUSTICE**



Fourteen members of the parish Racial Justice Committee met on July 17: Karen Miller, Peg Ekerdt, Ruby Kennedy, David Bruegging, Mary Ellen DeCoursey, Katie Levi, Bridget Gronniger, Larry Guillot, Mary Ann Heckman, Kristin Kratofil, Debi Sicoli, Mary Gigliotti, Matt Gunter, JoAnn Axtell.

Cristo Rey funding—one of our original and sustained efforts: Thirty-four parish families have pledged funding for the 2024-2025 school year. This is the fourth year RJC

has led the effort to support the presence of Cristo Rey interns at Visitation School.

School Collaboration Meeting: On June 3, school stakeholders/RJC members met to explore ways to collaborate on racial justice goals. Meeting participants: Nancy Hesse, Dianne VanBallas, Rachel Sexton, Jill Campbell, Bridget Gronniger, Amanda Adams, Peg Ekerdt, Linda Hughes, JoAnn Axtell. Building on the collaboration of the Dr. Martin Luther King celebration (led by Karen Miller and January 13 in 2025), the group discussed ways to continue to work together. To that end, the RJC has been invited and will plan the school Mass for Wednesday, February 26, 2025.

**Book Discussions:** Several titles have been suggested for a one-night discussion group: *Take My Hand* by Dolen Perkins-Valdez; *Fifteen Cents on the Dollar* by L. Story and E. Reed; *Beloved* by Toni Morrison; *Invisible Man* by Ralph Elison; *Facing Georgetown's History* edited by Rothman & Barrozo; *The First Ladies* by Benedict Murray; *How the Word is Passed: A Reckoning with the History of Slavery Across America* by Clint Smith; *The Sun Does Shine: How I Found Life and Freedom on Death Row* by Anthony Ray Hinton.

The committee will decide on books at the August meeting.

**Voter Registration**—Katie Levi will contact Shawn Kieffer to see if there are opportunities for our group to help with some aspect of this.

Prison Ministry—Matt Gunter shared a map that recognizes that the US has the highest incarceration rate in the world. In response, the group suggested hosting a panel on this topic, noting that last year's Social Concerns Hunger Banquet speakers were two formerly incarcerated people. This RJC program would seek a continued focus on the numbers incarcerated in this country, including the disproportionate number of people of color. Just Faith: Karen explained the new procedures and possible ways to continue and fund these sessions going forward. Vis has facilitated and hosted 7 sessions on Racial Healing, and 1 session on Changing Systems and Structures.

Next Meeting: Wednesday, August 28; August Agenda—Just Faith follow up and discussion of Black History Month.

### **CONFIRMATION CHANGES**

**PLEASE NOTE:** The Diocese of Kansas City - St. Joseph is changing the age of reception for the sacrament of Confirmation to students in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade. We will be adjusting the program to make sure all Vis children older than 6<sup>th</sup> grade who have not been confirmed will have the opportunity to be confirmed in the next two years. This will affect the following students:



- ⇒ **Incoming 10<sup>th</sup> graders** You can enroll in Vis Confirmation prep program this year. Please be on the lookout for more information to come this fall.
- ⇒ **Incoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders** You will enroll in the Confirmation program next year as a sophomore.
- ⇒ Incoming 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders who attend Vis You will receive preparation to be Confirmed through Visitation school.
- ⇒ **Incoming 6<sup>th</sup> graders who attend Vis** You will receive preparation to be Confirmed next year through Visitation school.
- ⇒ Incoming 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> graders who do not attend a Catholic elementary school You can enroll in the Vis Confirmation prep program later this fall. When help can't wait, Visitation St. Vincent DePaul steps in. In life, we are more comfortable with beginnings than endings. Recently, a call from a hospice chaplain allowed the Visitation St. Vincent DePaul Society the grace to enter the pain of a stranger, to hold her hand as she faced the unknown and to bring a small measure of peace. Debbie is 52 and has stage 4 cancer. She was used to being self-reliant and self-employed, but terminal illness unraveled her life. Our encounter with Debbie allowed us to see a life stripped back to essentials, where all that ultimately mattered was love.
