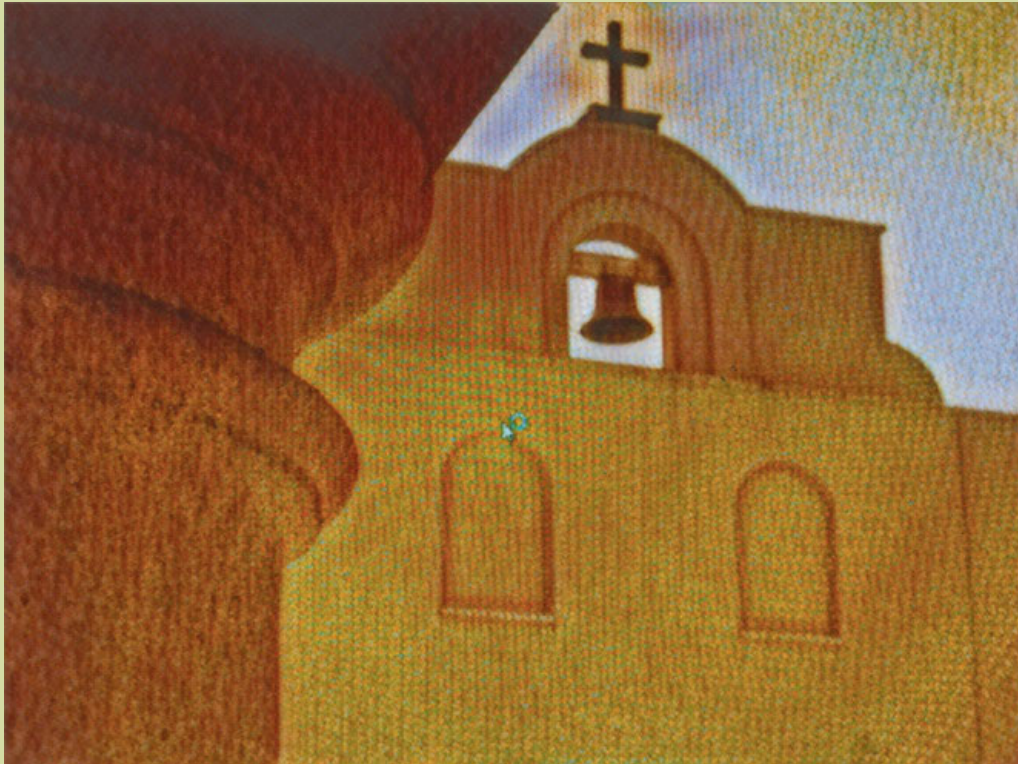

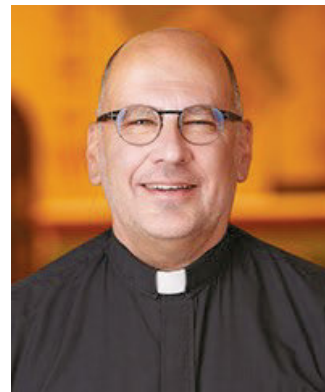

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

One of the most positive developments in our diocese since I was ordained is a greater attention to creating a safe environment in our parish communities. Given the tragic reality of abuse, especially as it has occurred in our diocese, we are working diligently to educate children, youth and adults through programs like Protecting God's Children. This course teaches participants about the realities of abuse: the effects of abuse on victims, warning signs of abusive behavior and patterns of grooming. It also empowers participants to communicate concerns and monitor behaviors in promoting a safe environment, especially for children. Protecting God's Children is required for anyone who works or volunteers with children in any parish or school capacity, but my hope is that everyone in the parish will eventually be trained. The information and empowerment are invaluable for all of us as we hope to eradicate abuse from the human story. As a church, it is our responsibility to promote this. I invite you to sign up for the next Protecting God's Children course on Wednesday, September 4, 6:30 - 9:30 pm in Tighe Hall.

PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN

REGISTER FOR PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN 4.0 WORKSHOP ON WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 4 FROM 6:30 - 9:30 PM IN TIGHE HALL

You need this course! There are so many opportunities to volunteer at the school or the parish. If you want to volunteer with children—this includes helping with lunches, being a room mom or dad, volunteering in the nursery, with school of religion or Vacation Bible School, etc., this workshop is required. Please read the information here completely: The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph REQUIRES all parish and school employees and volunteers who work with children (school and childcare volunteers, coaches, chaperones, SOR teachers, youth ministers, sacristans and Confirmation leaders) to take this workshop, register for a background check, sign an Ethics and Integrity in Ministry statement, take an on-line Mandated Reporter course and sign the Mandated Reporter acknowledgement. If you plan to volunteer with children in the parish or the school, please complete these requirements. Register online

at www.virtus.org. Click on registration, then select the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph, MO. You may expect to spend 2 hours completing this process. If you have any questions, please call Janet Ridder at 816-381-6910.

Inspired by Acts 2:42, we'll spend the afternoon making (and breaking!) bread, in fellowship and prayer. This afternoon is designed for each participant to be hands-on and heart-in!

There will be time for reflection and prayer during the kneading and rising, shaping and baking of dough, with quiet time for silent prayer, journaling or one-on-one sharing, culminating with the invitation to be “eucharist” for one another. The afternoon will conclude with a simple meal of bread and soup.

TAIZÉ PRAYER SERVICE IS SEPTEMBER 5

Taizé is an ecumenical, meditative prayer experience using music, chants and scripture. We gather on the first Thursday of every month at 7:00 pm. Each month we explore a different theme.

What is Taizé?

Taizé prayer is practiced throughout the world. It is a meditative candle-lit form of community prayer that includes simple chants sung repeatedly, silence and prayers of praise and intercession. In prayer, we enter the silence, stilling the mind, opening the heart, surrendering to the action of the Spirit ever molding us into the image of Christ. The candles used in the service symbolize the presence of the risen Christ, who conquered darkness and sin and offers new life to all humankind. Taizé Prayer comes from an ecumenical, monastic community in France and has spread to numerous spots around the world.

RACIAL JUSTICE



Fourteen members of the parish Racial Justice Committee met on July 17: Karen Miller, Peg Ekerdt, Ruby Kennedy, David Bruegging, Mary Ellen DeCoursey, Katie Levi, Bridget Gronniger, Larry Guillot, Mary Ann Heckman, Kristin Kratofil, Debi Sicoli, Mary Gigliotti, Matt Gunter, JoAnn Axtell.

Cristo Rey funding—one of our original and sustained efforts: Thirty-four parish families have pledged funding for the 2024-2025 school year. This is the fourth year RJC has led the effort to support the presence of Cristo Rey interns at Visitation School.

School Collaboration Meeting: On June 3, school stakeholders/RJC members met to explore ways to collaborate on racial justice goals. Meeting participants: Nancy Hesse, Dianne VanBallas, Rachel Sexton, Jill Campbell, Bridget Gronniger, Amanda Adams, Peg Ekerdt, Linda Hughes, JoAnn Axtell. Building on the collaboration of the Dr. Martin Luther King celebration (led by Karen Miller and January 13 in 2025), the group discussed ways to continue to work together. To that end, the RJC has been invited and will plan the school Mass for Wednesday, February 26, 2025.

Book Discussions: Several titles have been suggested for a one-night discussion group: *Take My Hand* by Dolen Perkins-Valdez; *Fifteen Cents on the Dollar* by L. Story and E. Reed; *Beloved* by Toni Morrison; *Invisible Man* by Ralph Ellison; *Facing Georgetown's History* edited by Rothman & Barrozo; *The First Ladies* by Benedict Murray; *How the Word is Passed: A Reckoning with the History of Slavery Across America* by Clint Smith; *The Sun Does Shine: How I Found Life and Freedom on Death Row* by Anthony Ray Hinton.

The committee will decide on books at the August meeting.

Voter Registration—Katie Levi will contact Shawn Kieffer to see if there are opportunities for our group to help with some aspect of this.

Prison Ministry—Matt Gunter shared a map that recognizes that the US has the highest incarceration rate in the world. In response, the group suggested hosting a panel on this topic, noting that last year's Social Concerns Hunger Banquet speakers were two formerly incarcerated people. This RJC program would seek a continued focus on the numbers incarcerated in this country, including the disproportionate number of people of color.

Just Faith: Karen explained the new procedures and possible ways to continue and fund these sessions going forward. Vis has facilitated and hosted 7 sessions on Racial Healing, and 1 session on Changing Systems and Structures.

Next Meeting: Wednesday, August 28; August Agenda—Just Faith follow up and discussion of Black History Month.

CONFIRMATION CHANGES

PLEASE NOTE: The Diocese of Kansas City - St. Joseph is changing the age of reception for the sacrament of Confirmation to students in the 6th grade. We will be adjusting the program to make sure all Vis children older than 6th grade who have not been confirmed will have the opportunity to be confirmed in the next two years. This will affect the following students:



- ⇒ **Incoming 10th graders** - You can enroll in Vis Confirmation prep program this year. Please be on the lookout for more information to come this fall.
- ⇒ **Incoming 9th graders** - You will enroll in the Confirmation program next year as a sophomore.
- ⇒ **Incoming 7th and 8th graders who attend Vis** - You will receive preparation to be Confirmed through Visitation school.
- ⇒ **Incoming 6th graders who attend Vis** - You will receive preparation to be Confirmed next year through Visitation school.
- ⇒ **Incoming 6th, 7th, and 8th graders** who do not attend a Catholic elementary school - You can enroll in the Vis Confirmation prep program later this fall. Please be patient and know there will have to be some flexibility as we all adjust and plan for this new Diocesan initiative. 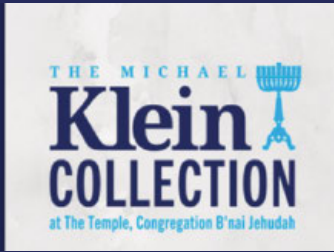
