# **PASTOR'S CORNER**

### Dear Parishioners,

Several weeks ago I gave an update on the project to renovate Visitation School. I've learned over the years that announcing something one weekend at Masses is not nearly enough, so I will share some of the information again.



Phase I of the project includes an extensive and modernized renovation of the school, including some exciting new features we'll be sharing in forthcoming renderings. Phase 2 will involve the construction of new addition on the north side of the school, which will provide space for preschool and other long-term needs. In the spring, after a presentation to the Diocesan Building Commission, we received approval from Bishop Johnston to proceed with Phase I of the project. On the heels of that, our building committee worked with the Hollis + Miller Architects and the Diocesan Construction Manager to prepare an RFP and to conduct the process of selecting a general contractor. The firm of Newkirk Novak Construction Partners was selected. They are a highly experienced team with many exceptional and highprofile projects in K thru 12 and higher education facilities. We are delighted to be working with them!

Our architects have since begun to work on more detailed plans that will allow our contractor to begin pricing the scope of work planned in Phase I. We believe it will ultimately lead to a project that will cost ten to twelve million dollars. To this end, our Campaign Steering Committee is working collaboratively with the various councils at the parish and school to lay the groundwork for the campaign. We are grateful that Terry & Lindsey Anderson will serve as Campaign Chairs. In the coming weeks, our planning teams will be mapping the timelines for the various phases of construction, working with the city and our neighbors on the necessary permits, and organizing and planning for a successful capital campaign, an endeavor that we pray will be embraced by everyone in our parish community. When you are invited to participate, to pray, to support, I hope you will say yes!

# **RACIAL JUSTICE**



The parish Racial Justice Committee is offering another way to explore the issues of racial justice with a series of book/movie discussions throughout the year.

RJC thus hosted the first in this year long series - a viewing of the film <u>Just Mercy</u> on October 8, featuring the story of Bryan Stevenson's efforts to end racial inequality and promote social justice in the American legal system. Bryan founded the Equal Justice Initiative ("EJI") in

1989 that is committed to ending mass incarceration and excessive punishment in the United States, challenging racial and economic injustice, and protecting basic human rights for the most vulnerable people in American society.

In a brief introduction before the film, parishioner and RJC member, Mandy Ketchum talked about her family's visits to EJI's Legacy Museum and the National Memorial in Montgomery, Alabama and EJI's powerful message of extending mercy to all.

Many who watched the film also had read the book, <u>Just Mercy</u>, and found the movie to be compelling in an even deeper way. Please schedule time to watch this movie on Prime. It is as well a good discussion starter for families with older children.

# **FINANCIAL**

September Contribution Income surpassed budget by \$38,164 or 18.09%, as a result of timing differences in the giving patterns of our parishioners.

Other Income, which includes ministries, program fees, miscellaneous one-time donations, school tuition, registration fees and before/after care fees, fell short of budget by \$15,202 primarily due to a timing difference in the FIRE grant check (\$19,666.67) projected to be received this month.

Parish expenses in September were over budget by \$27,796. This was fueled primarily by timing on the Donations to the Poor payouts to other organization and a one time set up fee of our new IT provider K12ITC (\$12,3156.00). The combined effects of the items discussed above generated a Parish Net Budget shortfall of of \$4,833 for the month of September.

For the YTD, Contribution Income is ahead of budget by \$32,218, or 4.5%. Other income is also ahead of budget by 6.8% or \$68,294,

leaving an Operating Income Budget surplus of \$22,963. Operating Expenses for the year-to-date, are under budget by \$63,96, or 4.3%, generating a parish net operating budget surplus of \$164,472.

Compared to the prior fiscal year-to-date, Parish Contribution Income for 2024/2025 surpassed last year's results by only \$40,235, and other income is ahead of budget by \$267,920 creating a Total Operating Income surplus of \$308,154. Parish Expenses were higher than last year by \$23,390 for a net budget surplus of \$284,764.


