### **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Parishioners,

Every fall, the diocese conducts the Annual Catholic Appeal, inviting us to support diocesan ministries by our sacrificial giving. Traditionally, each household in the diocese is asked to pledge 1% of gross income to this appeal so as to help fund the diocesan offices who support us. The Catholic Schools Office, Human Resources, Office of Child and Youth Protection, New Construction and others have all assisted Visitation over the past year, and we are grateful for the support.



Each parish has a goal set by the diocese to assist in realizing the larger goal. Visitation's goal is \$157,200, which is actually an increase over last year's goal. We have not come close to our goal in recent years (not even halfway to it), so I ask you to consider a gift this year. Unfortunately, parishes who fall short of their goals are penalized, while parishes who exceed their goals receive back 50% of any amount over and above the goal.

I hope you'll be able to make a gift to the diocesan annual appeal and assist the work of our diocesan offices.






