PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,


While today is December 8 and is the date of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, the Second Sunday of Advent takes precedence over the Solemnity in the hierarchy of liturgical feasts. When a Solemnity falls on a Sunday during Advent, Lent or the Easter Season, the Solemnity is transferred, usually to the Monday following, and the appropriate liturgy for Advent, Lent or Easter is celebrated on that Sunday. If a Solemnity falls on a Sunday during Ordinary Time (Assumption or All Saints, for example), the Solemnity takes precedence over the ordinary liturgy for that Sunday. While it might sound and feel a little complicated, it emphasizes the importance of the liturgical seasons, in this case, the Season of Advent, the days of which are so brief and incredibly precious.



So this year, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday, December 9.

And while the Solemnity is transferred, it remains a Holy Day of Obligation. In light of this, we will have 8:15 am and noon Masses on Monday, December 9 to celebrate the Immaculate Conception, the patronal feast of our diocese and of the United States. The 8:15 am Mass will be a School Mass, but all parishioners are welcome.




