




### YOUR HELP IS NEEDED TO LABEL SOAP FOR THE SOAP PROJECT!

work and plumbing. He also was a security guard in a mall. Most recently, he helped his neighbor with a roofing job on his home and the VRAC committee has seen his ability to fix many things around the house.

Miguel has legal status. He is working hard to learn English; however, his first language is Spanish. He is also studying for his driver's license exam, but at this time, would need transportation to work.






