## **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Parishioners,

One of the seven principles of Catholic Social Teaching is the Dignity of Human Work and the Rights of Workers. It is inherently holy for us to work, as God labors in the work of creation. God's work sets the tone for ours. So what we do and what our work produces is holy. I'm grateful that Labor Day reminds us of it every year, that every human being alive, and all of our predecessors, share in the holy task of God's creative and redemptive work. It reminds us to bring our best self to bear on what we do for a living and all that we labor to



do in the Reign of God. I'm thankful this Labor Day for the work my parents have done, the work my grandparents have done, and for the legacy of holy labor that we have inherited from all who have gone before us. It's astounding to realize what their years of labor have provided us, and how we are a part of the heritage now for our children and future generations.

With the arrival of fall, the ministry of Visitation School once again becomes tangible and visible. Our school is not a separate entity, functioning in its own atmosphere and context. Our school is a ministry of the parish, that is, one of the endeavors that flows from the Liturgy. Before his Ascension, Jesus instructs the disciples (and us, by extension) to "go and make disciples." That is one of the primary things we do at Visitation School all year long. This parish community generously supports the ministry of making disciples because we know how important it is, not only for the church, but for the world. The Gospel message has the power to save, to restore, to redeem, and our world will always need that. Many schools have moved to a funding model based on tuition, or tithing plus tuition. As a parish community, we boldly continue the ministry of Catholic education by our sacrificial giving. This keeps the gift of a Catholic education open to everyone, not just those who can afford tuition. It's a bold and powerful witness to the importance of Catholic education here, that our entire parish community recognizes the value of it and shares the responsibility for its sustenance.
