FINANCIAL

Contribution Income:

In October, Contribution Income exceeded budget expectations by \$10,266 (3.5%), driven by timing differences in the giving patterns of our parishioners.

Other Income:

Other Income, which encompasses ministries, program fees, one-time donations, school tuition, registration fees, and before/after care fees, also surpassed the budget by \$15,215. This increase was primarily due to a timing difference in tuition payments, particularly the MoScholars payment received this month.

Parish Expenses:

Parish expenses for October exceeded the budget by \$59,828. The overage was largely due to a three-pay-period month, higher-than-expected benefit costs and additional computer software expenses, exceeding budget by \$14,687.

As a result, the Parish Net for October reported a budget shortfall of \$34,347.

Year-to-Date (YTD) Financial Summary

Contribution and Other Income:

Contribution income is anead of budget by

\$42,483 (4.2%). Other Income has exceeded budget expectations by \$83,509 (8.7%). Together, these resulted in a budget surplus of \$125,993 for the year-to-date.

Operating Expenses:

Operating expenses are under budget by \$13,426 (0.7%), leading to a Parish Net Operating Budget surplus of \$139,419.

Comparison to Prior Fiscal Year:

Parish Contribution Income for FY 2024/2025 is \$53,763 higher than the same period last year. Other Income surpassed last year's results by \$266,968. Net Budget Surplus: The overall net budget surplus stands at \$159,162.




CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR VOLLEYBALL TEAMS!

Additionally, we celebrate our City Champions: the 7A and 8B Volleyball teams. Well done to all our athletes for their hard work and dedication!


RACIAL JUSTICE
